

DOUG LARUE



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Doug LaRue explores the balance between technique, concept and inspiration through technology, identity, and contemporary culture with layered original mixed media compositions integrating hand painted elements utilizing digital and traditional tools.

Artist Statement

My art often involves fusing realist, figurative and/or abstract paintings into contemporary mixed media. I endeavor to capture moments when physical, emotional and ethereal experiences are in synchronicity. The outward nature of emotion often results in abstract expression—the more visceral the emotion the more expressive. Creating abstract images during the development has become a strong part of the process of aligning frequency with concept.

My work begins with a pencil or pen to develop the initial ideas. Once the concept begins to solidify the art elements and reference images are moved into the digital space, where I further develop compositions, explore form, and refine the conceptual direction of each piece. Often times this digital stage serves as an underpainting—a foundational layer where structure, balance, and intent are established. The digital stage becomes a feature element on an hand painted background. The work transitions into the physical world. Each composition is produced as a high-quality print on fine art substrate, becoming the starting point for a final analog treatment. I build upon this surface using mixed media—paint, mark-making, texture, and material interventions—allowing the piece to evolve beyond its origin.

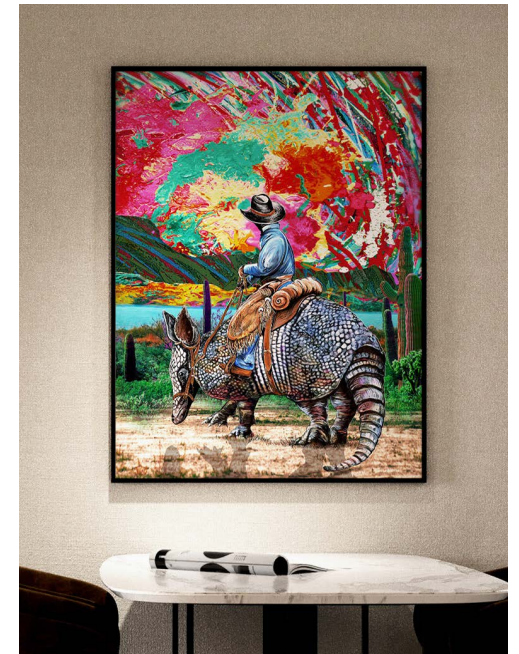

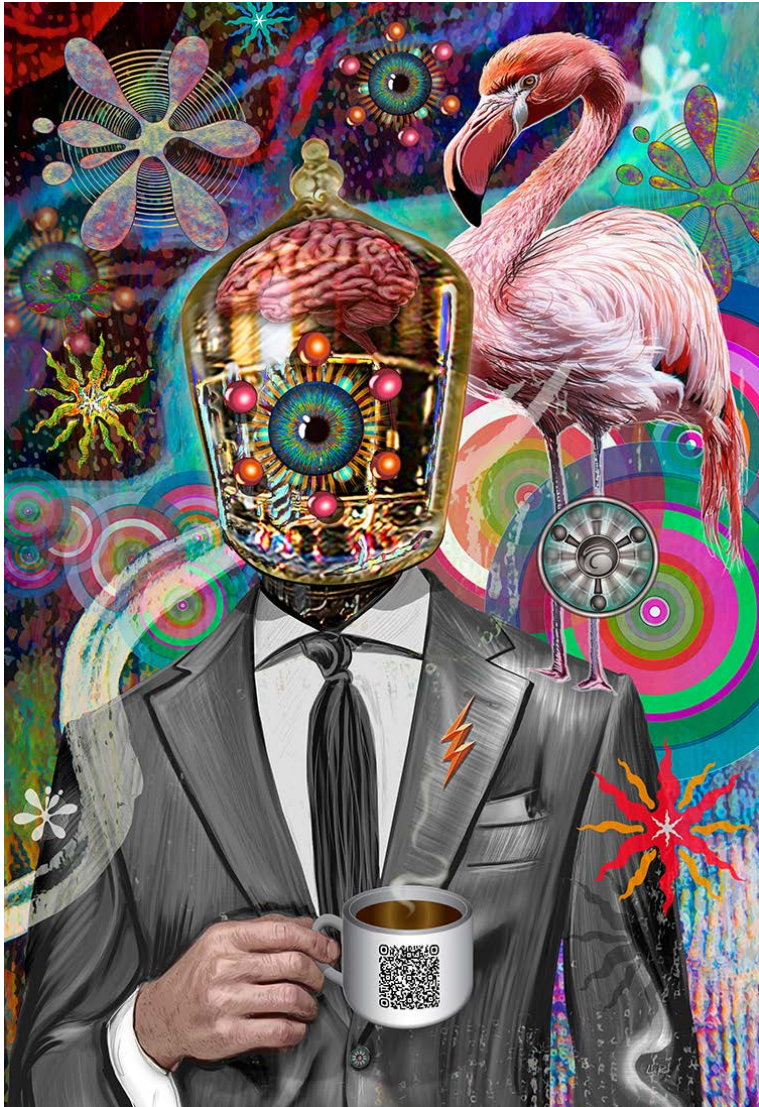

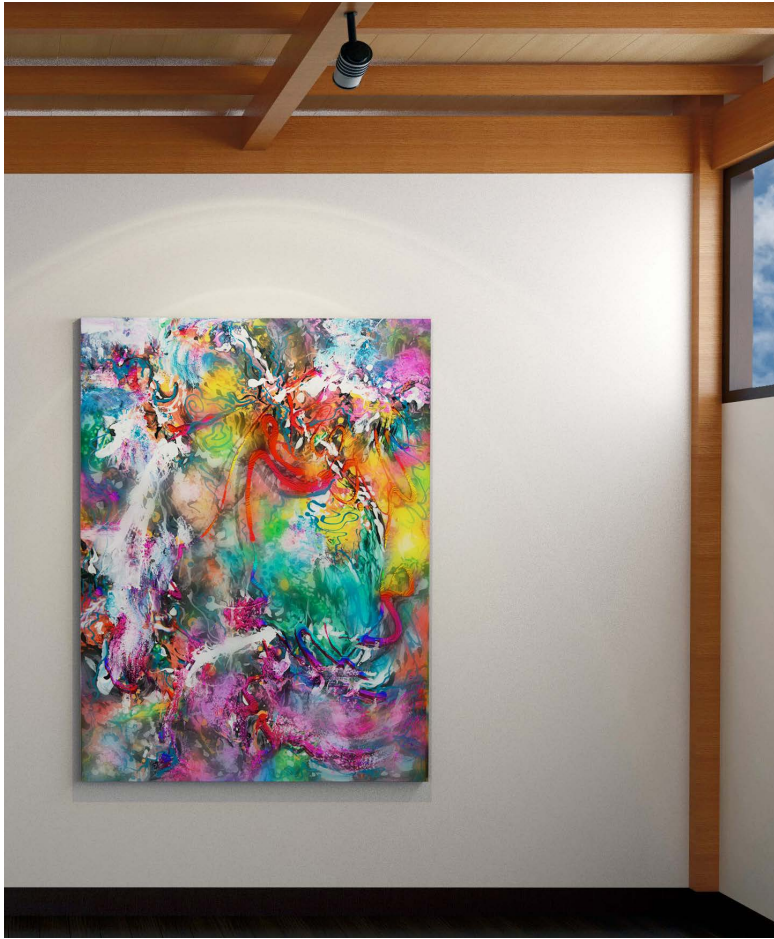

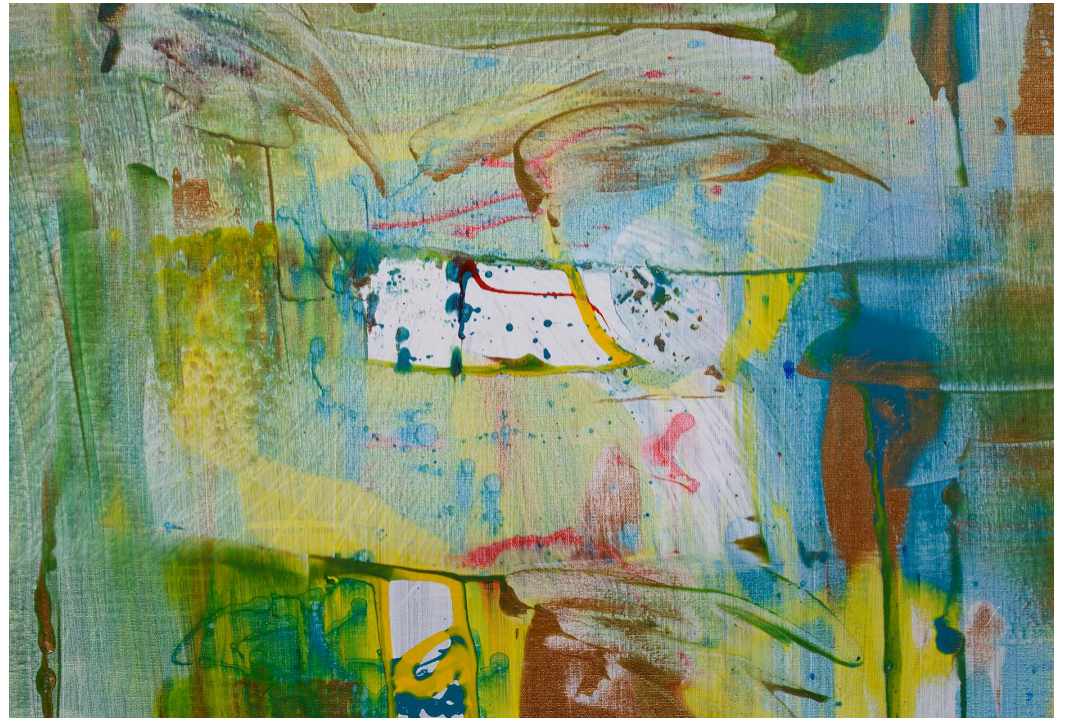

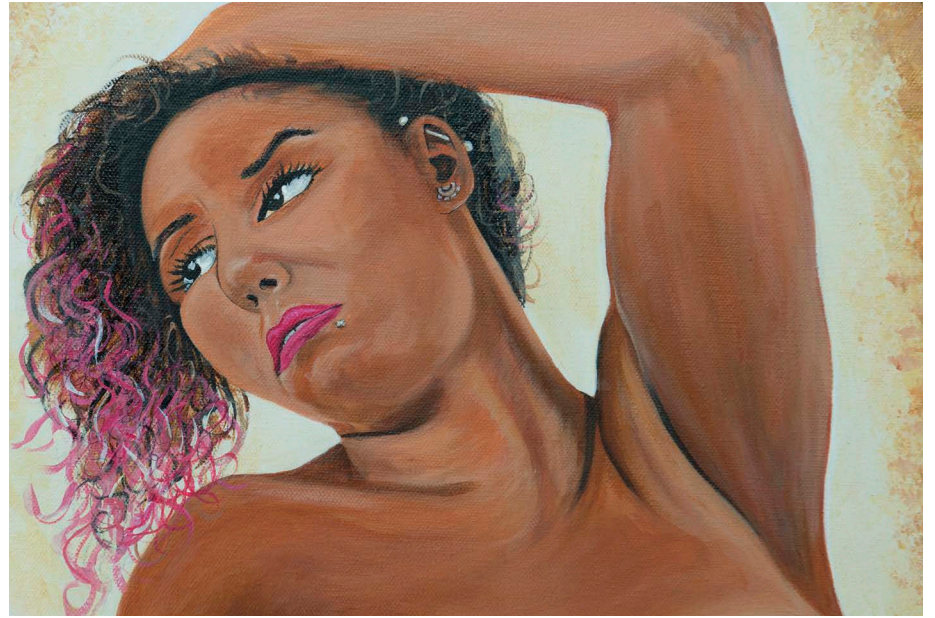

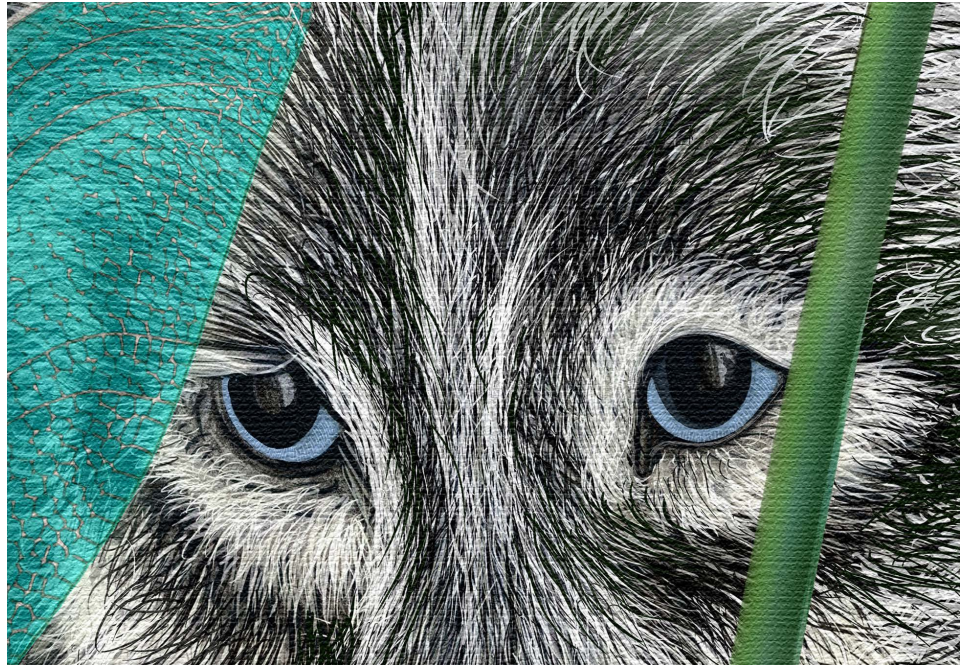
